Part of their instruction has included how to make a virtual museum using PowerPoint that they will use for their Service / Civics project. The project will be

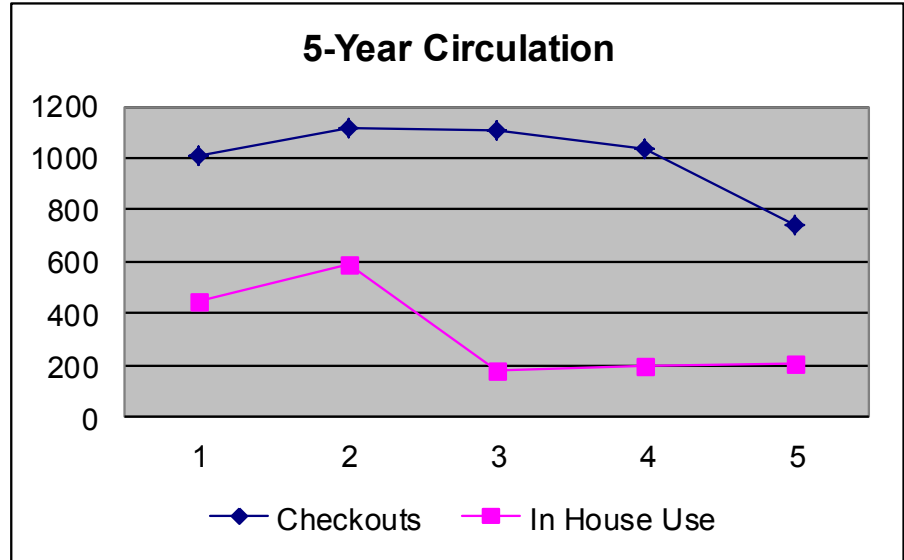
an ongoing project with a new exhibit added each year to illustrate that year's service.

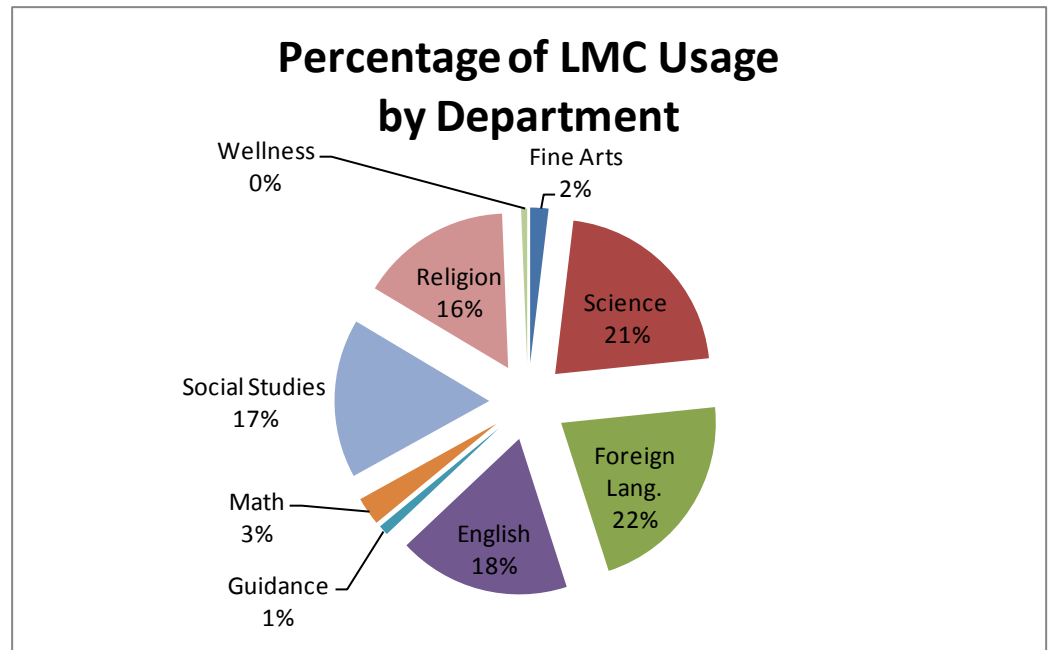
## 5-Year Circulation Statistics

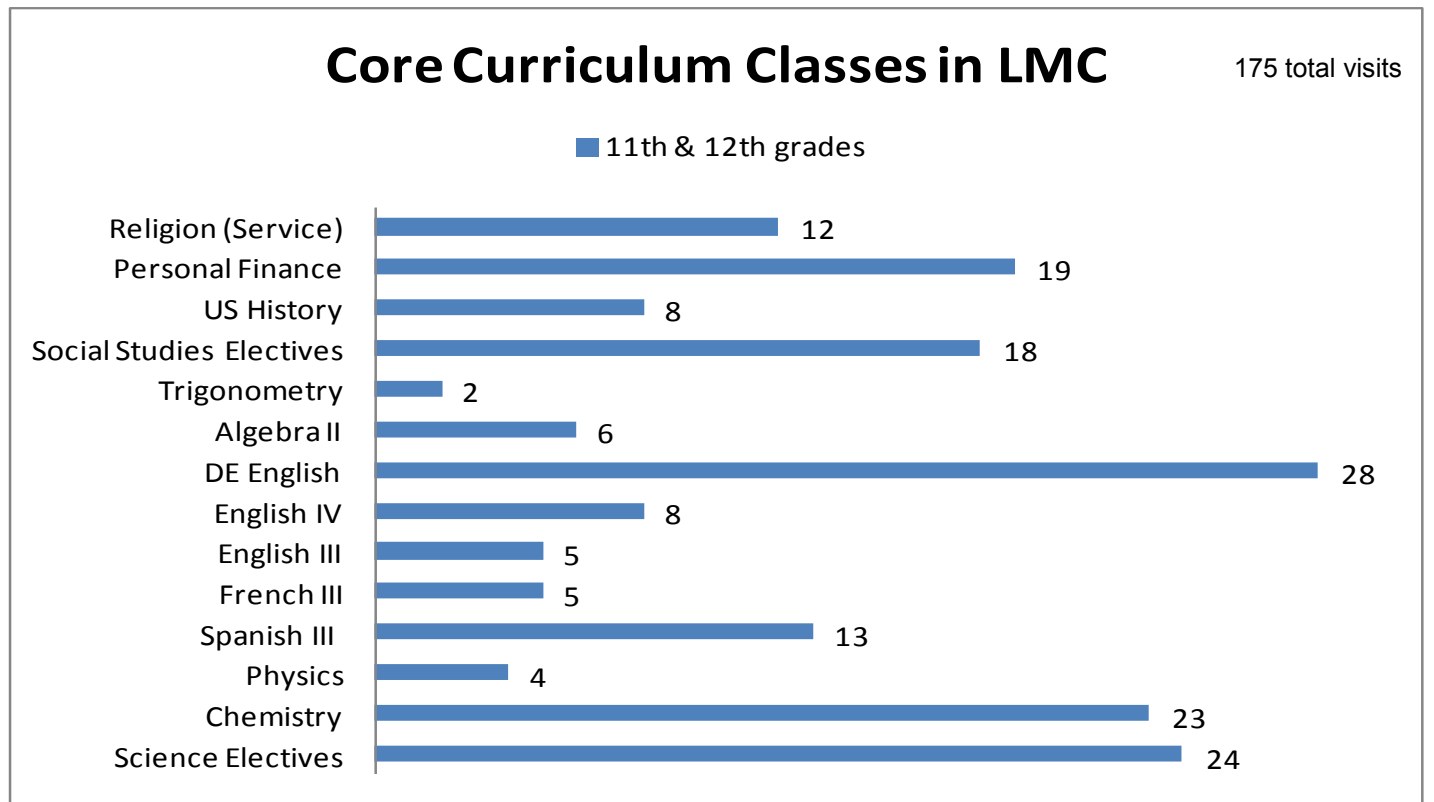
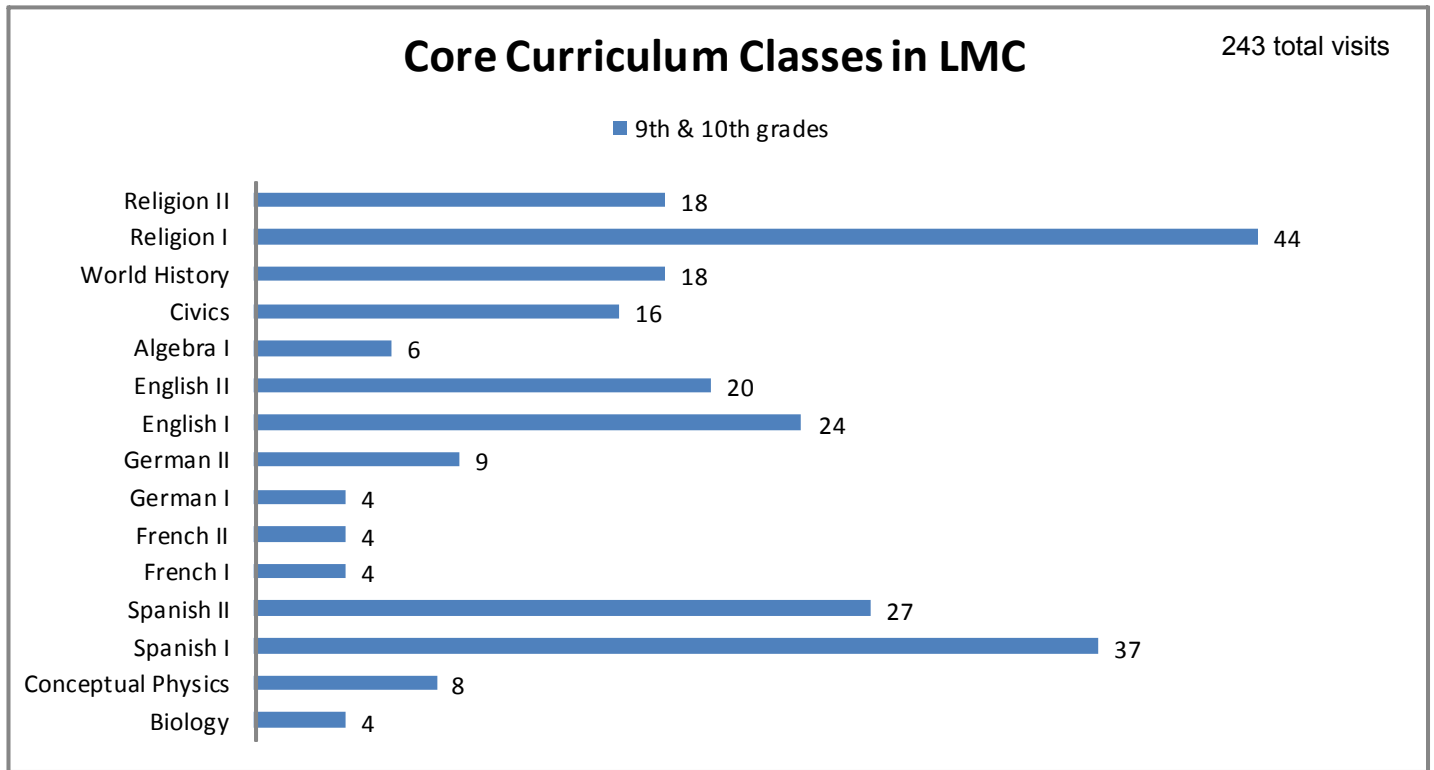


## LMC Usage by Department

## Getting Ready for Summer

### Returning Library Materials:

In the next few days you will receive an e-mail entitled Notification from Your Library that will contain a list of all materials that you currently have checked out.

**All items must be returned by May 24** in order for Mrs.

Trice to complete inventory. If you wish to check out items during the summer, you may do so after the items have been inventoried.

Please return print and AV (DVD, VHS, small equipment ) materials as soon as you are finished with them. If you have items you will not be using any more this year, please return them immediately.

**Do not return large equipment items such as projection carts and TV's until the week of May 20.**

As a courtesy, you should clean chalk dust and other debris from items before returning them.

### Preparing Your Classroom for the Summer as per Mr. Reardon:

Team Reardon will be updating all computers, including those on the projection carts, during the summer. The LMC will not be available for use during June & July. If you need to use a school computer, one or more will be available in Room 9.

For inventory purposes, projectors should have an LMC barcode label + a white Cart label. Cart computers and classroom computers will also have a white label. If your items do not have these white labels, please let Mr. Reardon know. It is not necessary to put any additional names / labels on the classroom computers. If you wish to have the same LMC labeled equipment next year, we can label it when you check it in.

Back up any files stored on your desktop or in the server documents file before shutting down for the summer.

Disconnect all peripheral devices from the classroom computer: mouse, keyboard, surge protector, network cable, etc. Lock these items up in a safe place. If you do not have a place to lock up peripheral devices, Mrs. Trice can store them for you over the summer. It seems that every fall we are missing necessary peripherals. Network cables and surge protectors are especially prone to disappearing over the summer. Please help us cut costs by locking up this items. They are not needed for updates.

Classroom printers are not catalogued and do not come under the Reardon summer rehab program. Printers are part of your classroom furnishings. Label them accordingly or lock them and their peripherals in a safe place.

Only equipment that has an LMC barcode or a Cart label will be stored in the LMC. Space is limited. Please do not ask the Reardons to work around items that essentially belong to your class-

room.

If you have special needs or requests that can be attended to during the summer, complete a Request for Summer Services form. This form is attached to the email notification about this newsletter. Return the form to Mr. Reardon's box in the Teacher's Lounge or outside his office door.

If you have special needs for a specific time frame during the summer months, complete a Request for Summer Services form attached to the email notification about this newsletter. Then meet with Mr. Reardon to discuss your needs so that he can have everything ready at the proper time. Since updates are done assembly line style, please make your requests as soon as possible.

FYI, we will be moving to MS Office 2010 only in the fall. All 2007 docs will convert.
